The nursing home is a public institution that receives federal government funds. The services provided are for seniors over the age of 60 whose families have abandoned them or that do not have the economic means to support themselves.

The facilities are divided in three sections, women's, men's and couple's. There is also a clinic and activity rooms. The government provides the home with qualified staff members, including doctors, nurses, psychologists, therapists, etc. Residents receive medical attention and participate in a series of physical activities such as exercise classes, knitting, ceramics, carpentry, and other manual skills.

Casa Refugiados is a Civil Association that provides humanitarian assistance to persons seeking refugee status, refugees, and stateless persons. Casa Refugiados offers complementary protection, and assists with food and clothing, health and primary

It also organizes and carries out educational awareness to the public on the situation of refugees in Mexico and the creation and strengthening of support networks. CR receives support from UNHCR.

Casa de Acogida y Formación para Mujeres y Familias Migrantes (CAFEMIN) is a nongovernmental organization that provides temporary shelter, assistance and job training to migrant women, families and seekers of asylum or refuge, coming from the different countries of Central America, South America and other continents.

The House was founded nine years ago by the Congregation of the Hermanas Josefinas, with the idea of going beyond the basic needs of lodging, toiletries, food and medical services to migrants; the Sister help them integrate into the productive society, providing them with the tools necessary to start a new life when they decide to stay in Mexico. The aim of the Center is to welcome and contribute to the process of training and empowerment of migrant women and their families, potentializing their abilities and personal skills, in order to achieve a satisfactory and full integration in the country.

CAFEMN welcomes migrants for a period of two to three months, during which offered job training in bakery shops, gastronomy, computing and sewing. CAFEMIN also has complementary services in health, and psychological and legal advice in the migration process.
