If the intern has a business administration or related background, he/she can assist in developing and facilitating workshops on basic accounting, how to calculate costs and prices, commercialization and other business development workshops.

Specific tasks will include:

- Accompanying CIS grassroots promoters to evaluations with small businesses
- Writing up evaluations in Spanish and English
- For persons with business administration or related background, assisting in developing workshops on basic accounting, administration, commercialization, calculating costs, etc.

Complete all tasks assigned, which includes but is not limited to the responsibilities outlined above.

Expected work hours: 8 hours per day, 5 days a week
