Boğaziçi University was officially established in 1971 as a Turkish public university, but its history goes back to Robert College (1863), the first American college set up outside the United States.

The University includes four faculties, six graduate institutes, a School of Applied disciplines, and a School of Foreign Languages.

Boğaziçi University Summer Term is an intensive seven-week program offering a rich variety of courses in the social and natural sciences, humanities, engineering and technology. The medium of instruction is English (unless otherwise specified). The Summer Term begins in mid-June and ends by the second week of August.
