Executive Vice President Engineering, Airbus

Jean-Brice Dumont was appointed Executive Vice President Engineering at Airbus in April 2019 and is a member of the company's Executive Committee.

With over two decades of industry experience, he joined Airbus Commercial Aircraft in this role in January 2018 after six successful years as Executive Vice President, Engineering and Chief Technical Officer at Airbus Helicopters. Undergraduate Program Director, Space Engineering, Department of Earth & Space Science & Engineering, Lassonde School of Engineering





Alumna, Mechanical Engineering, Lassonde





Fernanda Sierra


Alumna, Culture and Expression Program, LA&PS
