

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

TRAVEL RESIDENT VISA OR ETA



Required to *travel* to Canada (except for US citizens). Typically issued automatically once study permit is approved (no need for separate application).

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STUDY PERMIT



Issued at the Canadian border upon arrival. Confirms your temporary resident status as a *student* in Canada.

Study permit application: When do I apply? COVID-19 TEMPORARY MEASURES & POLICIES

(IRCC) <u>has announced that</u> study permit applicants who submit a **complete study permit application** by May 15, 2021 will get a decision by August 6, 2021.

IRCC may not be able to process your application by August 6, 2021, if you're unable to submit a complete application because of COVID-19 restrictions, such as reduced service at visa application centres (VACs) or other providers.

NOTE: You can still submit your application after May 15, 2021, however it may not be processed by August 6, 2021.

Either way, **it is strongly encouraged** that you apply as soon as possible after receiving your letter of acceptance.



Study permit application: When do I apply? COVID-19 TEMPORARY MEASURES & POLICIES

- Can I start my program even if my application has not yet been approved?
 - If you are outside of Canada: YES
 - You do not require a study permit if you are studying online from outside Canada
 - HOWEVER, strongly encouraged to submit your application before program begins
 - If you are inside Canada: IT DEPENDS
 - If you already hold a study permit and <u>have applied to extend it</u>, you can study while waiting for approval
 - If you had a work permit or visitor status and applied for a study permit, <u>you CANNOT study</u> from inside Canada until your study permit is approved

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Study permit application: How do I apply?

- Review <u>IRCC's website</u> for information, instruction guide, eligibility requirements, application forms, document checklists
 - Use only official Government of Canada information
- Application must be made outside of Canada
 - US citizens and permanent residents can apply at border but discouraged during COVID-19.
 - Work or study permit holders already in Canada should apply to extend status
 - Study permit holders implied status and can start studies
 - Work permit or visitor permit holders must have study permit approved <u>before</u> starting
- Apply online directly (paper applications unavailable at this time)
 - Complete "eligibility questionnaire" to generate correct application



Study permit application: How do I apply?

Should I hire a legal representative to assist with my study permit application?

- > You are not required to hire a legal representative to help you apply for your study permit application
- That said, there are considerable benefits to hiring an <u>licensed</u> representative who is <u>experienced</u> in this particular area of immigration law to assist with your study permit application if you are able to.
 - Familiarity with the study permit application process
 - Knowledge about how to **proactively** address common reasons for refusal
- > Find out if your representative is authorized (Lawyer, Immigration Consultant, Paralegal).





Study permit application: What do I need to apply?

Application Forms

- IMM 1294 (Application for a Study Permit made Outside of Canada)
- IMM 5707 / 5645 (Family Information Form)
- Schedule 1 (if applicable)
- Any other forms required by your visa office
- Mandatory Supporting Documents supporting documents must be in English or French and accompanied by an affidavit who completed the translation
 - Valid passport
 - Check validity date
 - Letter of Acceptance
 - Verify LOA includes tuition, start date, DLI#, etc
 - Proof of financial ability
 - Medical exam, <u>if applicable</u>
 - Recommended to complete medical exam before applying
 - Visa photo

- Employment history: employment is not mandatory. You must complete at least one line and can fill in your most recent education details instead.

- What if my letter of acceptance is conditional?
 - You can and should still apply for a study permit, as 'full acceptance' letters are not generally issued
 - In your letter of explanation, you should explain how you will clear the conditions & provide any relevant supporting documents (e.g. grade reports/marksheets provided to date)
 - Note: The Student Direct Stream may require an unconditional letter of acceptance. In this case, may need to <u>apply through the regular stream</u>.



A study plan is like a cover letter (1-2 pages)* for your application and helps to establish that your true intention is to seek a permit to study in Canada and not for some other reason.

Common questions to establish that you are a genuine student:

Why do you want to study in York University (speak in specific, factual and practical terms)
 Why this step in your education journey is logical/beneficial

- > Why can't you do it in your home country or neighbouring countries (be specific)
- > How your studies will help your employment prospects (be specific, provide proof where possible; a letter from an employer who may hire you when you return could be very helpful, for example)

*Check your <u>local visa office requirements</u> for any specific instructions regarding the study plan, such as the questions to ensure you address or a page/word limit.



A study permit is an application for **temporary residence**, i.e. an officer must be convinced that you will leave Canada once you complete your studies / at the end of your authorized stay.

An IRCC officer has a wide range of decision making power to decide what will be factored into this analysis.

Ties to home country means explaining various aspects of your life that **bind** you to your home country: **Why would you want to or need to return home after your stay in Canada?**

Examples of ties to your home country:

- > Family, family obligations and social relationships (a sworn affidavit can help)
- > Documentation of an existing business or employment that you will return to
- > Documentation of career potential including statistics from a reputable source, such as your government, showing that people with your skills are in high demand; or a letter from a potential employer.
- Property / assets
- > Bonds paid to your government or scholarship funders to guarantee your return



Proof of means of financial support

•IRCC wants to see that you have strong proof of financial support.

•Must show sufficient (liquid) funds for your tuition, living costs & travel, for your first year of studies.

- Your letter of acceptance will indicate:
 - Cost of tuition for one year
 - Books/Personal expenses
 - Residence/Meals
 - Health care
- You should be prepared to demonstrate the ability to fund one full year of tuition and a **minimum** of \$10,000 for your first year of living expenses (additional if accompanying family members)
- Source of funds must be *clear*, *sufficient* and *reliable*.
 - Eg. If your funds are being provided from a parent or family member, they must provide proof of WHERE the funds are coming from (e.g. if they are working, they should provide an employment letter, if they have a business, they should provide proof of business ownership). Additionally, it is important to provide a letter from the sponsor (preferably notarized) explaining that they will support your studies in Canada.
 - **Third party funds** (funds from anyone else other than yourself or your parents): not preferred; will be assessed on a case-by-case basis
- Check your local visa requirement instruction guide for specific financial support documentation that is required.



Proof of means of financial support - continued

Recommendation: include a cover letter that lists all of the documents that you are submitting as proof of financial support for your application.

The cover letter should include:

- > Your name, your date of birth and UCI number
- > The title "Proof of Funds and Financial Support"
- > A brief summary confirming that you meet the eligibility requirement for having sufficient funds
 - The funds required for me to study and live in Canada are approximately [insert the amount]. This amount is based on an estimated cost of tuition for one year [insert amount of tuition] as indicated in my letter of acceptance and [xxx amount] for living expenses. Below is a list of documents proving that I have sufficient financial funds to cover these costs.

Do I need to provide proof of paid tuition?

Whether you should provide proof of paying the registration deposit and/or your tuition for the purpose of your study permit application depends on a few factors.

STEP 1	Consult your <u>country-specific visa office requirements</u> and ensure you are following the specific requirements listed there
STEP 2	For the standard study permit application stream, proof of paid tuition or a registration deposit is not a requirement to submit a complete study permit application UNLESS it is specified in your country-specific visa office instructions. Again, ensure to double check this using the link directly above for your specific country's requirements.
STEP 3	HOWEVER, proof of paying your registration fee and tuition (partial or full payment) can serve to strengthen your study permit application in the sense that doing so may lend credibility to the fact that you are a genuine student, with genuine intentions to study in Canada. Depending on how much you pay upfront, it can help to demonstrate to IRCC that you have the financial means to afford your education and living expenses in Canada.
application a	officers have a wide range of decision-making power when evaluating a study permit nd proving financial sufficiency is one part of a larger assessment made by the IRCC officer whether you meet the requirements to study in Canada.
STEP 4	If you wish to pay deposit /tuition fees as evidence to support your study permit



What if I can't provide a document due to COVID-19?

- If you can't provide a document due to COVID-19 service disruptions (e.g. medical exam, police certificates), you can still apply. Note, however, that your application will not be processed within the August 6, 2021 deadline IRCC will process these applications as quickly as possible but there is no guarantee of a decision before the fall semester begins.
- You must include a letter of explanation in place of the document outline why you can't provide the document.
- You <u>will need to provide all required documents before a final decision</u> on your application can be made.

Student Direct Stream

- SDS is an <u>expedited study permit application process</u>, available to those residing in:
 - India, China, Philippines, Pakistan, Vietnam, Morocco, Senegal
- Processing time = 20 calendar days
 - Expect delays due to COVID
- MUST apply online and include mandatory documents:
 - Letter of Acceptance
 - Upfront medical exam
 - Guaranteed Investment Certificate (GIC) of \$10,000 CAD
 - Proof of tuition payment for first year of studies (= 2 terms)
 - IELTS (6+) (* required even if was not required for your admission to Schulich)
 - Most recent educational transcripts
 - Study plan
 - Additional documents may also be required <u>based on country of residence</u>

If you do not have all of the mandatory documents, your application cannot be processed under SDS

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Nigeria Student Express

- >Nigeria student express stream (NSE) is very similar to SDS.
 - No information about this program available on IRCC's website.
 - We will circulate information sheet prepared by the Nigeria High Commission that explains NSE requirements.



Study Permit Application: How will my application be assessed?

Study Permit Eligibility Requirements:

- Acceptance to a designated learning institution
- Genuine temporary resident
- Financial ability to fund tuition, living expenses, travel costs
- Admissible to Canada

- No criminality/medical issues/etc
- The visa officer will assess your application based on the documents you provide to substantiate the above



Study Permit Application: Submitting your application

Online application tips

- Merge together and upload all additional documents under "Client Information" (i.e.: cover letter, study plan, etc)
- Use "?" button to view additional document instructions or examples
- Take screen shots during application (once documents uploaded, submission page, "successfully submitted" page)
- Be sure to check your spam/junk mail for correspondence from IRCC, or regularly check your online account



Study Permit Application Refusals

Common Refusal Reasons

1) Unclear and/or insufficient financial documents

2) "Unreasonable studies"

X Other reasons:

Your proposed studies are not reasonable in light of one or more of: your qualifications, previous studies, missing marksheets, academic record, level of establishment, language abilities, or your future prospects and plans.

3) "Not satisfied that you would leave Canada at the end of your stay"

- You have not satisfied me that you would leave Canada at the end of your stay. In reaching this decision, I considered several factors, including:
- travel history
 immigration status in country of residence
 family ties in Canada and in country of residence
 length of proposed stay in Canada
 purpose of visit
 employment prospects in country of residence
 current employment situation
 personal assets and financial status.
 - your history of having contravened the conditions of admission on a previous stay in Canada

Study Permit Application: Accompanying Family Members

Accompanying Family Members

- Family members can apply to accompany you to Canada
 - Includes spouse/common-law partner and dependent children
- Can either apply together or separately after your study permit is approved
 - Recommended to apply simultaneously
- <u>Children intending to study in Canada</u> should apply for a study permit (no letter of acceptance required)
 - If not intending to study, can apply as visitor
- Spouses are eligible to apply for an open work permit, or can apply to enter as visitor

- Put your best foot forward with your first application ensure you include all mandatory and supporting documents
 - Review visa-office instructions
 - Apply on-time
- Don't underestimate the importance of this application
- Decisions are up to the discretion of the officer
- Continue to monitor current COVID-19 situation; be aware that processing and decisions may be impacted
- If you receive a request for additional documents, complete <u>IRCC Request Form</u>
- If application is refused, contact me as soon as possible to discuss next steps


