WHAT IS A POST-GRADUATION WORK PERMIT?

<u>An open work permit</u> that allows international students to remain and work in Canada after completing your studies
Valid for between 8 months and 3 years, depending on the official length of your program
Applicants can receive only 1 post-graduation work permit in their lifetime
A job offer is not required
You can work anywhere in Canada, in any occupation, even if it is unrelated to your studies and change employers any time you wish The only exceptions are jobs at risk of exploitation or employers on the ineligible employers list.
Work obtained through the PGWP may help to support your application for permanent residence in Canada



PGWP: When should I apply?

1. Finish your studies

After you complete your program and receive your final marks 2. Maintain valid status if applying from within Canada

While waiting for your marks, if you are inside Canada, make sure your study permit remains valid or else

- <u>Apply for a visitor record</u> to stay in Canada longer, or
- Leave Canada and apply for your PGWP

3. What does it mean to have valid status?

Your study permit becomes invalid 90 days after you receive confirmation that you have completed your studies or the expiry date on your permit, whichever comes first

4. Time limit for inside Canada applicants

Must submit application within **180 days** of receiving your final marks

HOWEVER

You must submit while your study permit is still valid (within 90 days of program completion) OR must ensure that you have an alternate valid status, such as visitor status (not recommended to go this route).

5. Time limit for outside Canada applicants

Must submit application within 180 days of receiving your final marks

AND

Your study permit must have been valid at some point within these 180 days



PGWP: Am I eligible to apply?

Frequently asked questions PGWP: Am I eligible to apply?

- 1. Can I apply before I graduate?
 - You may apply for a post-graduation work permit **after** you complete your studies, not before.
- 2. When am I considered to have "completed" my studies? Is it once I receive my final grades or once I attend my graduation ceremony?
 - At York University, you are considered to have completed your studies once you receive your final marks, after which point you should prepare and submit your PGWP application within **90 days**. Submission of your PGWP application within 90 days of receiving your final grades is important because you must have a valid status when you apply for your study permit. Remember, a study permit is valid only for 90 days after receiving your final grades OR the expiry date on your permit, whichever comes first.
- 3. What are the documents that I need from York University to apply for my PGWP
 - You require two documents from York: (1) Confirmation of Graduation Letter (2) Your transcript (either official or downloaded from York's website)
 - It will take about 6 weeks from the date you receive your final grades for your graduation details to be finalized and to receive the required documents
 - Instructions on *how* to obtain these documents are in the upcoming slides
- 4. My study permit expires at the same time or around the same time that I am expecting to receive my final grades, but it takes 6 weeks to receive the documents I require from York to apply, and my study permit will expire by then. How do I ensure that I have a valid study permit when I apply for the PGWP?
 - If your study permit is going to expire around the same time as you are finishing your studies, you should apply for a short study permit extension. This is referred to as a "**bridging study permit extension**" and typically is granted for an additional 90 days, which serves as a transition period for you to prepare for any next steps, including pursuing the option of applying for your PGWP.

PGWP: requirement to maintain full-time status in each semester of your study program*

- ☐ Check your academic record to date
 - > Undergraduate students = Full time status is 9 credits **per semester** OR 6 credits per semester if you were registered as having a permanent disability with Student Accessibility Services
 - Graduate students & Continuing Studies = defined by your program
- * Exceptions
 - > It was the final semester of your studies
 - You were on an <u>authorized leave</u> that did not exceed 150 days
 - You withdrew from classes due to a <u>labour disruption/strike</u> at York University
- ☐ Speak to an international student advisor and immigration specialist if:
 - > There is one or more semester that you were **not** enrolled as a full-time student (apart from your final semester)
 - > This includes if you withdrew from a course beyond the drop deadline and now have a "W" on your transcript
 - You took a leave from studies that was not authorized
 - You took a leave from studies that was authorized **but exceeded** 150 days
 - You took a leave from studies due to a labour disruption / strike at York University



PGWP: Determining the length of post-graduation work permit

PGWP: Check your expiry dates



Make sure your passport is valid for the entire length of time you should be eligible for the PGWP.

See here for what to do if your passport expires earlier and you are unable to renew it in time before you submit your PGWP application.



Note: Study permits are invalid 90 days after completing studies even if the expiry date is later



If you need a new visa to enter Canada, you can apply for one online *after* you've received your PGWP





STEP 1: GRADUATION ELIGIBILITY AND STATUS

1. Apply to graduate

- June 2021 convocation: If you are eligible to graduate at the June 2021 convocation but missed the deadline to apply, you may face a delay in receiving the documents that you need for your PGWP application. In this case, email degaud@yorku.ca to inform the degree audit team that you are an international student and require your graduation letter and transcript documents for your work permit application, they may be able to process your application in time for the June 2021 convocation
- > October 2021 convocation: The deadline to apply to graduate in October 2021 is July 30, 2021

2. Determine Graduation Eligibility and Status

- Undergraduate Students: Your graduation eligibility is evaluated by the Degree Audit Office once you apply to graduate
- > Faculty of Graduate Studies: please contact the Graduate Program regarding your status and eligibility
- > Certificate students: please contact the Department/School administering your certificate for your status and eligibility

2A. Once your final grades are posted, your academic decision will confirm if you are eligible to graduate

Graduation Status

Once you have applied to graduate with an undergraduate degree you can verify your graduation status online. The system will indicate if your application to graduate has been received, if your file has been audited and if you are eligible to graduate.

Verify Your Graduation Status

You will <u>not</u> receive a notification once your status is updated, so be sure to check every day.

Your status will change to "eligible to graduate"



STEP 1: GRADUATION ELIGIBILITY AND STATUS (continued)

3. Once all degree requirements have been met, your degree conferral will be available on transcript according to the table below:

STEP 2: REQUEST YOUR GRADUATION LETTER

Once your graduation status says "eligible to graduate", you can apply for your graduation letter




Once your order is processed it will be transmitted from York University to the MyCreds.ca Learner Portal. You will receive an email notification that your letter is ready for payment, viewing and secure sharing online through the MyCreds.ca Learner Portal.



STEP 2: REQUEST YOUR GRADUATION LETTER (continued)







Your graduation letter should state: "This letter is to confirm that [...] has **successfully completed all requirements to graduate from the following degree program".**It should NOT state that you are "potentially eligible" to graduate.



STEP 3: OBTAIN YOUR TRANSCRIPT

Get your documents ready

Before you can apply for a PGWP, you need

- an official letter from your school that confirms you've completed your study program
- an official transcript, or a copy of your transcript from your school's website



STEP 3: OBTAIN YOUR TRANSCRIPT (continued)

NOTE: Your unofficial transcript will be accompanied by a letter that confirms the current transcript procedure and policy due to COVID-19 and that the attached transcript has been issued by the University.

If you do not receive this letter, please email transcpt@yorku.ca to follow-up. In the subject line, write:

"Time-sensitive, document required for work permit application" and in the email write, "Hello, my name and student number is.... I recently requested a copy of my unofficial personalized version of my transcript. I also require a letter from York University confirming the temporary transcript policy, namely that official PDF transcripts are not available at this time but that transcript provided to the student should be considered official and has been issued by the University."



What kind of transcripts can be ordered?

Please note: Once you have submitted your transcript order, you will not be able to cancel it or request a refund of your payment.

1. Through OUAC

If you are applying to an Ontario university, we strongly encourage you to apply through OUAC (Ontario Universities' Application Centre). Transcript requests received through these services will continue to be processed remotely on a daily basis and in a timely fashion. You can check the OUAC website for the status of your request.

2. Digital Transcript (password protected)

York University does not currently have a digitized version of an official transcript. Due to COVID- 19 we are providing a non-printable pdf transcript PDF copy of your transcript to recognized institutions which is nonprintable. Please note: this PDF transcript differs from an official transcript which is printed, as both the signatory as well as logos are not present.

There are two types of digital emailed transcripts:

(b) Unofficial personalized version – A copy of your personalized transcript will be sent to the email listed on their student account. To submit your request, fill out the Unofficial Transcript Request - Summer 2021 form.

- It may take between 3-5 business days to process your request.
- Starting May 16, 2021 students who had previously ordered an unofficial transcript may now submit one for Winter 2021 (please note: once you have requested an unofficial transcript, the next time you will be able to order is September 2021).
- Please note: This is not your official transcript. Information displayed on your personalized version will differ from what is printed on your official transcript (as an example: class average does not appear on this personalized version). Should you require an official printed copy of your transcript, please use the option #3 below.
- Grade report legends by Faculty can be found here.



STEP 3: OBTAIN YOUR TRANSCRIPT

3. Printed Transcripts

Requests for "Printed Transcripts" will be mailed to institutions when an address instead of a recognized institutional email is provided. To request your printed transcript, submit the Online Transcript Request. Note:

- Transcripts are printed once a week and may take up to 7 days from initial order to be mailed.
- Please indicate a mailing address with your request attention: Printed transcripts are mailed through either regular mail or by courier.
- ****Please note: We cannot guarantee the time regular mail delivery will take. If transcripts sent to a Canadian institution have not been received after 21 days or one sent to a U.S or International institution have not been received after 30 days, please contact us.

Do you have a Document to Accompany Your Transcript?

If you have a form or document that must accompany your transcript, note that there is an additional \$25 fee. Please make sure to submit your document here.



Step 4: Prepare a Letter of Explanation and additional supporting documents as needed

It is recommended for all applicants to submit a letter of explanation (LOE), which is a good way to describe your unique situation or include additional documents, including:

- 1. The purpose of your application
- 2. Issues you would like to make clear or that the officer might find useful
- 3. Supporting documents, screenshots or any other proof to support your explanation
- 4. Additional employment history if you have run out of space in the employment" section of your application

It is recommended that you prepare a letter of explanation <u>and</u> speak to an international student advisor if one of the following scenarios applies to you:

- 1. If you had an authorized gap in studies
- 2. If you had an unauthorized gap in studies
- 3. If you studied part-time at any point during your degree (not including your final term) due to a reduced course load approved by Student Accessibility Services
- 4. If you studied part-time at any point during your degree (not including your final term) and it was **not** approved by Student Accessibility Services
- 5. Took courses at another Canadian DLI and/or wish to combine two programs

PGWP and COVID-19 IMPACTS

Immigration, Refugees & Citizenship Canada has temporary PGWP eligibility rules in place, which allow **100%** of your studies completed online from outside of Canada between **spring 2020 and December 31, 2021**, to be counted toward the length of your PGWP. This also applies to students completing two study programs.

Previous rules that required half of the program to be completed inside of Canada and indicated that online studies would count only up until April 30, 2021, are replaced by the <u>updated rules announced on February 12, 2021</u>, which is summarized below.

According to the <u>IRCC's updated PGWP rules</u>, if you are outside of Canada, 100% of online studies completed between spring 2020 and December 31, 2021 count toward a PGWP if:

- You are enrolled in a program that was in progress in March 2020, or
- You have started or will start a program between spring 2020 and fall 2021, and
- You have a study permit, or
- · You have been approved for a study permit, or
- You applied for a study permit before starting your study program and your study permit is eventually approved.

If you are completing two study programs, the programs must have been ongoing or started between March 2020 and fall 2021, and

- Both study programs are from an eligible DLI and are completed within two years.
- Each program meets all <u>PGWP eligibility requirements</u> and is at least eight months long.

If you are inside Canada, it remains that 100% of online studies count toward PGWP if your in-person classes in Canada have been moved to an online-only format because of COVID-19.

Whether you are inside or outside Canada, you must also meet all other **PGWP** requirements.



How do I sign my online application?

You have to type in your name and answer a security question to submit your application. **This is your electronic signature. Do not** print out your application form to sign it.

To sign your online application:

1) Type your name in the boxes.

Your given name and last name must be **exactly** the same as on your application form. If you're under the age of 18, your parent or guardian must sign your form for you.



2) Answer the security question.

This will be one of the four security questions you created when you registered your <u>account</u>. You must answer exactly as you did when you created them.

More frequently asked questions

- 1. I am currently eligible to work as an international student. Can I continue working part-time after finishing my program?
 - No, you must stop working once you receive your final grades even if you currently are eligible to work.
- 2. Can I work while waiting to receive my PGWP?
 - You can work full time while waiting for your PGWP if:
 - You submitted your PGWP application **and** your study permit was valid at the time of submission
 - You completed your program of study
 - You were eligible to work off-campus, and
 - > You did not work off-campus more than 20 hours a week during academic sessions
- 3. How can I show a potential employer that I'm allowed to work while I wait for my PGWP?
 - See IRCC's guidance on this question here.
- 4. Do I apply to renew my travel visa at the same time as my PGWP?
 - If you are applying from within Canada, you will submit your application for your PGWP *first.* Once it is approved, you can apply to renew your travel visa.

Working towards permanent residence



What kind of job should I get?

To be eligible for the most common programs, you need 1 year of skilled full-time work experience (or the equivalent in part-time work)

Skilled means a NOC code 0, A or B


