Casa de Acogida y Formación para Mujeres y Familias Migrantes (CAFEMIN) , is a non-governmental organization that provides temporary shelter, assistance and job training to migrant women, families and seekers of asylum or refuge, coming from the different countries of Central America, South America and other continents.

The House was founded nine years ago by the Congregation of the Hermanas Josefinas, with the idea of going beyond the basic needs of lodging, toiletries, food and medical services to migrants; the Sister help them integrate into the productive society, providing them with the tools necessary to start a new life when

they decide to stay in Mexico. The aim of the Center is welcome and contribute to the process of training and empowerment of migrant women and their families, potentializing their abilities and personal skills, in order to achieve a satisfactory and full integration in the country.

CAFEMN welcomes migrants for a period of two to three months, during which offered job training in bakery shops, gastronomy, computing and sewing. CAFEMIN also has complementary services in health, and psychological and legal advice in the migration process.

Areas of activities for interns:

1. Assist in organizing social and recreational activities for children of migrants.
2. Assist in office with administrative work.
3. Facilitate social and recreational integration of migrants
4. Support other volunteer staff.

Language requirements for all placements:

Fluent Spanish is a pre requisite. Students will go through an interview process in Spanish with LaSalle.

Students receive a La Salle student ID, which permits the access to University facilities such as the gym, library and cultural

events. Interns are also invited to participate in cultural excursions that are organized by CIEL.

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
