

What is a PGWP?

- > A PGWP is an open work permit that allows international students to remain and work in Canada after completing their studies. The work experience you obtain through the PGWP may help to support your application for permanent residence in Canada. A job offer is not required to apply.
- > Applicants can receive only 1 PGWP in their lifetime
- > You must have graduated to apply, but you do not need to wait for convocation. You cannot apply before completing your program.

Am I eligible for a PGWP?

- You have to have completed your study program
- > It must be an academic, vocational, or professional training program:
 - At an eligible designated learning institution (York is an eligible DLI)
 - That was at least 8 months long and
 - Led to a degree, diploma or certificate
- You must have maintained full-time student status during each academic session of your program(s), with exceptions for:
 - Final term may be part-time
 - Authorized <u>leave</u> from studies of 150 days or less
 - Not able to be full-time due to a labour disruption/strike at York University
- > You must apply within 180 days of receiving your final grades. However, if you are applying from inside Canada, you should apply before your study permit becomes invalid (first of: expiry or 90 days after receiving your final grades).



Full-time student status

NOTES

- Registered disability: Students registered at SAS with a reduced courseload are considered full-time with a minimum of 6 credits each Fall and 6 credits each Winter. However, since this doesn't appear in the student information system or on your transcript, please contact an international student advisor for advice if you have a reduced courseload.
- **Academic breaks**: An academic break is a period common to all students in your program when you are not required to enroll. Examples include the Winter closure, Summer (for most undergraduate programs) and reading weeks. For School of Continuing Studies students, the break between courses in your program is an academic break. During an academic break, you may be enrolled part-time, full-time or not at all without impacting your study permit or PGWP.



How long will my PGWP be?

- > PGWPs can be issued for between 8 months and 3 years, depending on your program length.
- If you take more than one PGWP-eligible program within 2 years, you may submit documents for both programs and have the combined length be considered for your PGWP application. For example, if you take two PGWP-eligible programs that are each 1 year long, you would be eligible for up to a 3 year PGWP.

Program length (combined possible)	PGWP length			
8 months to 2 years	Up to same length as program			
2 years or more	Up to 3 years			



What if I want to study more?

- > While it is possible to have both a study permit and a PGWP at the same time, work experience while you are a full-time student does not count towards all permanent residency programs.
- > Since the PGWP is a once in a lifetime opportunity, you may need to be strategic about when you want to apply for the PGWP.
- > If you are planning to study more, you may want to either:
 - Apply for PGWP, get the work experience you need for PR, get PR and then start your new program or
 - Start and finish your new program before applying for PGWP, assuming it is a PGWP-eligible program



Do online studies count toward PGWP?

- > Under normal circumstances, all distance learning courses that a student completes outside Canada are excluded from the time that counts toward the length of the PGWP, and 50% of a student's courses must be completed in Canada and in person.
- > Due to COVID-19, there is a temporary policy in effect allowing some online studies to count towards PGWP eligibility. For full eligibility details, see PGWP distance learning.
- Note that **for all students**, any time spent studying before you applied for a study permit as well as any time spent studying from outside Canada after August 31, 2023 does not count.

Full facilitation measures	Students who started their program on or before August 31 2022 may complete 100% of their studies online from outsic Canada between March 2020 and August 31, 2023.			
Reduced facilitation measures	Students who started their program between September 1, 2022 and August 31, 2023 must complete at least 50% of their program in Canada (online or in-class).			



Where can I work on a PGWP?

- > You can work anywhere in Canada, in any occupation, even if it is unrelated to your studies. With the exceptions of:
 - jobs at high risk of exploitation
 - employers on the ineligible employers list
 - jobs requiring a medical exam if you haven't done one
- > You may change employers any time you wish.
- > You may work full-time, part-time or be self-employed on a PGWP. However, self-employed work does not count towards some PR programs.





Applying to graduate

- It is your responsibility to ensure you have met all your program and degree requirements. You should check with your Faculty or program advising office if you are unsure.
- > In your final term, you need to apply to graduate.
- Applications are processed in the order received, so it is best to apply early. If you apply past the deadline to graduate, you will be moved to the following convocation ceremony. This may cause complications for the timeline to receive the documents you require for the PGWP application. Please contact an International Student Advisor if you have missed the deadline to apply for graduation.

When should I apply for PGWP?

1. Finish your studies

You must first complete your program and receive your final grades to be eligible for a PGWP.

2. Maintain valid status

While waiting for your marks, if you are **inside** Canada, make sure your study permit remains valid. Your status ends on either your **study permit expiry or 90 days** after completing your program, whichever comes first.

If you need more time, you should either apply for a bridging study permit extension to have an extra 90 days, apply for a visitor record or leave Canada.

3. Apply for PGWP

PGWP applications must be submitted within 180 days of receiving your final grades. Your study permit must have been valid at some point in these 180 days (unless exempt due to COVID-19 distance learning measures).

However from inside Canada you must submit your application while your study permit is still valid or ensure you have alternative valid status (such as visitor). It is best to apply while you still have student status.



FAQ on timeline

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE TO GET MY DOCUMENTS?

You should expect it to take about 6 weeks between receiving your final grades and having all the documents from York that you will need to apply for PGWP. Once you have received your final grades, a final audit must be done. Then, you can request your documents which take 1-2 weeks to prepare.

WHEN DO I HAVE TO STOP WORKING?

- When you receive your final grades you are no longer a full-time student and you cannot work under the authorization of your study permit.
- Once you have submitted your PGWP application, you may be eligible to work while IRCC processes your application.

WHAT IF MY STUDY PERMIT IS EXPIRING?

- Do not let your status expire!
- If your study permit is going to expire around the same time as you are finishing your studies, you should apply for a short study permit extension. This is referred to as a "bridging study permit extension" and typically is granted until the end of your program plus 90 days. It serves as a transition period for you to prepare your next steps, including pursuing the option of applying for a PGWP.





Check your expiry dates



- Make sure your passport is valid for the entire length of your PGWP. We recommend you renew your passport 6 months in advance, if possible.
- If you cannot renew your passport to have the validity you need, your PGWP will have a note and you can extend for this reason only.



Note: Study permits are invalid 90 days after completing studies, even if the expiry date is later.



If you need a new visa to enter Canada, you can apply for one **after** you have received your PGWP.

SCHOOL OF CONTINUING STUDIES

you must get your graduation letter and transcript from your Student Portal. It takes approximately 3 weeks after you finish your program for these documents to become available.



Check your graduation status

- Once your final grades are posted, your academic status will confirm if you are eligible to graduate.
- ➤ Before you request your graduation letter and final transcript, ensure your graduation application has been processed. Check your graduation status and eligibility. Graduation status is typically processed three times a year: end of January, end of May and end of August.

Graduation Status

Once you have applied to graduate with an undergraduate degree you can verify your graduation status online. The system will indicate if your application to graduate has been received, if your file has been audited and if you are eligible to graduate.

Verify Your Graduation Status

You will not receive notification

once your status is updated, so be sure to check every day. Your status will change to "eligible to graduate"



Graduation letter

- > Once your graduation status says "eligible to graduate," you can <u>request your graduation letter</u> (#7 in the list). It costs \$25 and takes about 2 weeks to process.
- > The letter you need must state "This letter is to confirm [...] has successfully completed all requirements to graduate from the following degree program." It should not state "potentially eligible to graduate."

Choose this option If you need a letter indicating that you are potentially eligible to graduate, or that you have already graduated for the purpose of obtaining your Post-Grad Work Permit.

Who can use this option?

Students who have applied to graduate or have graduated.

How much does this letter cost to prepare?

This letter costs \$25 each.

How do I get this letter?

Complete this form.

Once your order is processed it will be transmitted from York University to the MyCreds.ca Learner Portal. You will receive an email notification that your letter is ready for payment, viewing and secure sharing online through the MyCreds.ca Learner Portal.

Transcript

> Once your graduation status says, "eligible to graduate," you can <u>order your digital transcript online</u>. It costs \$15 and takes 1-2 business days to process. The transcript should say "degree conferred."

Please note: A new pricing structure will take effect on March 30, 2022 for all Official/Unofficial Transcript Requests:

- Official Digital Transcripts Only available through MyCreds \$15 (no change)
- Unofficial Transcripts available through MyCreds \$10
- . Official Hard Copy Transcripts \$30
- Couriered transcripts will continue to be available for an additional fee

Once you have submitted your transcript order, you will not be able to cancel it or request a refund of your payment.

Please note, all Digital transcripts must be shared by the student or alumni with a third party on MyCreds.

1. Through OUAC

If you are applying to an Ontario university, we strongly encourage you to apply through OUAC (Ontario Universities' Application Centre).

Transcript requests received through these services will continue to be processed remotely on a daily basis and in a timely fashion. You can check the OUAC website for the status of your request.

2. Digital Transcript

- a. Available through MyCreds™. York University's official documents are issued directly through MyCreds™, a trusted, internationally verified digital credential platform. Documents issued through MyCreds™ are verifiable, secure, and include a cryptographic signature.
- Official Digital transcripts cost \$15 per share credit.
- Unofficial Digital Transcripts cost \$10 per share credit.
- Once your order has been processed, you will receive an email from the MyCreds[®] system, with payment information and details
 on how to share your document. For more information, visit the MyCreds[®] website.

b. If you require a transcript for yourself, note you can share the document to your email account once the order is submitted.



Passport and digital photo

- > For the passport, you should include copies the of ID page and all pages with markings (e.g. stamps, visas) in your passport
- If you have renewed your passport since your last application to IRCC, you should submit copies of both your old and new passports with this application. You can also state in your letter of explanation that you recently renewed and are including both passports.
- > See the <u>specifications for the digital photo</u>



What about biometrics (fingerprints and photo)?

- ▶ Biometrics for visas, study permits and work permits are valid for 10 years. If you are not sure if/when you've given them in the past, you can use the <u>biometrics check status tool</u>.
- > Due to COVID-19, some people may be exempt from giving biometrics. Check to see if you are exempt from giving biometrics.

Steps if you must give biometrics:

- 1. Pay the \$85 fee with your application
- 2. Get an instruction letter
- 3. Book an appointment (select Service Canada Centres)
- 4. Give your biometrics



Letter of explanation

- It is recommended that all applicants submit a letter of explanation (LOE). It is a way to outline your application, describe your unique situation and introduce other supporting documentation.
- Include in your letter:
 - The purpose of your application
 - Issues you would like to make clear or that the officer might find useful
 - Outline any supporting documents, screenshots or any other proof you are submitting to support your explanation/application
 - Additional information if you have run out of space in the IMM form
- > See the **template letter guide** available on <u>York International's immigration application resources</u>.



Supporting documents

- > If you are explaining any special circumstances in your PGWP application, you should include supporting documentation to back your claims up. This can include, but is not limited to:
 - Doctor's note
 - Letter from a therapist or counsellor
 - Letter from your Faculty to support an authorized leave
 - Letter from York International (see next slide) to help explain your transcript



Supporting letter from York International

There are several situations where York International may be able to provide you with a letter to support your PGWP application. If any of the following apply to you, please connect with an international student advisor in your final term of studies so that we can advise you and potentially help with a letter.

- > You had 1 or more **part-time terms** (other than your final term)
 - This includes if you dropped or withdrew to less than 9 credits near the end of a term or after the term ended
- > You have a registered disability with SAS and have a reduced courseload
- > You have any gaps in studies, including
 - authorized leave of more than 150 days
 - any unauthorized leave
 - gap due to a strike
- You began in a Winter term
- > You had deferred standing in your final term and graduated later than anticipated
- > You completed an **8-month course in your final term** i.e. it ran over Winter and Summer or Summer and Fall
- > Took courses at another Canadian DLI and/or wish to combine two programs
- > Any other situation where your transcript may look like you were not full-time throughout your program





Processing time and fees

Processing times fluctuate. You can <u>check the processing times</u> <u>online</u>, but these are averages rather than an accurate prediction of when you will receive a decision.

Document Checklist for Application for a Work Permit Made Outside of Canada








Download current form(s)

How do I sign my online application?

> You have to type in your name and answer a security question to submit your application. This is your electronic signature. Do not print out your application form to sign it.

To sign your online application:

1) Type your name in the boxes.

Your given name and last name must be **exactly** the same as on your application form. If you're under the age of 18, your parent or guardian must sign your form for you.



2) Answer the security question.

This will be one of the four security questions you created when you registered your <u>account</u>. You must answer exactly as you did when you created them.

Can you help me with system issues?

I CAN'T LOG IN TO MY IRCC ACCOUNT!

- If you are trying to sign in and you keep getting sent back to the homepage, try the following:
- 1. Try another browser
- 2. Try clearing cache
- 3. Try another device

I CAN'T ACCESS THE IMM FORM!

- You need Abode Reader to open the IMM form. If you don't have Abode, you can download it online for free.
- > It is not possible to open the IMM forms in a browser. You must download it, save it to your computer and then open the file from the saved location.





Can I work while waiting for my PGWP?

When you receive your final grades, you must stop working under the authorization of your study permit. There will be a time between receiving your final grades and submitting your PGWP when you are not eligible to work at all.

You may start working again if you meet all of the following:

- > You had a valid study permit when you submitted your PGWP
 - "Maintained status" is not a valid study permit
 - Study permits become invalid 90 days after receiving your final grades even if your study permit says it expires later
- You have completed your program and applied for PGWP
- You were eligible to work off-campus without a work permit and never worked more hours than you were authorized to

IMPORTANT NOTES

- If any of these conditions don't apply to you, you cannot start working until you receive your PGWP.
- If your PGWP is refused, you must stop working immediately.



How can I show a potential employer I'm eligible to work?

- ➤ If you received the WP-EXT for PGWP (IMM 0127 E) letter
 - You're authorized to work until a decision is made on your work permit application, even if the 120-day validity period
 has expired.
 - If you need proof of authorization to continue working, you can ask for it by using the IRCC web form.
- If you are eligible to work while waiting for a PGWP decision and you need to prove to an employer that you're eligible to work, provide the employer with a copy of all the required documents.



What about my SIN?

- If your SIN expires, but you are otherwise eligible to work, you can continue to use your <u>expired SIN</u>.
- > Once you receive your PGWP, you should <u>apply for a new SIN</u> online or at a Service Canada Centre.



Can I travel outside Canada while I wait for my PGWP?


- > You must have a valid eTA or visa to be able to return to Canada.
- > If you leave and re-enter, you can still work full-time while you wait for a decision (if eligible).
- > When you arrive in Canada, be prepared to answer questions at the border. We recommend you have copies of all the documents from your PGWP application with you, in case you need them.
- > Before making travel plans, see IRCC's information on traveling while waiting for PGWP.



How do I get a new travel visa?

If you are applying from inside Canada, it is a two-step process. You apply for your PGWP first. When it is approved, you can apply for a travel visa based on your work permit.





What kind of job should I get?

To be eligible for the most common programs, you need 1 year of skilled full-time work experience (or the equivalent in part-time work)

Skilled means TEER 0, 1, 2 or 3 (formerly code 0, A or B)

- > Find your NOC code
- ➤ The job title is not so important focus on the main duties
