

## **Land Acknowledgement**

York University recognizes that many Indigenous Nations have longstanding relationships with the territories upon which York University campuses are located that precede the establishment of York University.

York University acknowledges its presence on the traditional territory of many Indigenous Nations. The area known as Tkaronto has been care taken by the Anishinabek Nation, the Haudenosaunee Confederacy, and the Huron-Wendat.




## **Setting Up Your Passport York (PPY)**

Here is a step-by-step process for registering a PPY:

- 1) Click on "New student sign up" on the right side. The hyperlink is highlighted in image 1.
- 2) Enter your **student number (9 digits), and date of birth**, and click "sign up". Your student number can be found in the acknowledgement email you received after applying! An example of this is highlighted in image 2.
- 3) Follow instructions to create your username and password. This login info will give you access to all of your student accounts and security guarded York systems.

#### **COURSE TYPE**

There are different course codes that tell you how the course is being delivered:

Abbreviation	Course Type
LECT	Lecture – some in-person components
TUTR	Tutorial
ONLN	Online – not on-campus (Asynchronous)
BLEN	Blended Learning
ONCA	Online but exams and assignments on-campus
HYFX	Hyflex - Hyflex courses take place in classrooms that have the appropriate technology that allows students to opt for in-person or remote learning, usually synchronous.

- **Asynchronous** = the course is not delivered in real time (I.e., lectures may be recorded)
- **Synchronous** = live lecture (I.e., regular Zoom lectures at a consistent time weekly)

### What is the online student account?

- Similar to a York bank account
  - It will show you all outstanding balances, including tuition fees, interest charges and any other fees that are chargeable to your student account (ie. Residence fees)
- After enrolling in courses, you will see an outstanding balance on your student account. <u>The full Fall balance must be paid</u> in full by <u>September 10th</u> to avoid interest charges.
  - A 1% interest charges accrues on the 10th of each month for any outstanding payments
- In order to confirm your enrolment, you must pay a \$300 deposit to your student account on the 15th day of the month after you enroll into classes

#### **Your Student Account**



Program fees for online/remote courses are the same as for inperson courses. Some supplementary and associated course fees, where the associated service is not able to be provided online or remotely, will be waived. More details are available on the Course and Program Fees web page.

When York University communicates with you about your student account, we will always direct you to make payments to York through your financial institution, with "York University" as the Payee. You will never be directed to make payments, via cheque or cash, to any other "Payee". Please read How to make payments for full details.

Student Account Online Statements become available online around the 18th day of each month and an email notification is sent as a reminder. You will need your Passport York ID to access your personal online student account.


Transactions made after the statement date (e.g. adds, drops, payments) can also be viewed on your Student Account Online Statement: click on the **View Transactions** heading.

It is your responsibility to view your current account status and recent statements, and to pay outstanding amounts on your account.

### **How to Access Your Student Account**



- Go to "View All
  Transactions" to see your
  statement
- A positive balance means you have an outstanding balance with York
- A \$300 deposit must be paid on the 15th day of the month after you enroll into classes
  - For example, if you enrol into classes in June, your deposit is due July 15th
  - The deposit comes out of your total tuition fees

#### **International Students**

York University has partnered with two providers (CIBC and Western Union Business Solutions) who offer secure online portals for International Students to make payments for course/program fees, residence, health care and UHIP charges appearing on their Student Account Online Statem

These portals provide the following benefits:

- Easily make payments in your preferred currency;
- Access competitive foreign exchange rates;
- · Multiple payment options; and
- Student support provided by the service provider.

You can compare both for payment options and rates, and choose the best one that meets your needs.





WU GlobalPay for Students

As an international student, you may pay your deposit via:

- CIBC International Student Pay
- Western Union GlobalPay for Students
- This allows you to pay in your preferred currency from your preferred bank account
- Same deadlines still apply



## How to pay your enrolment deposit & tuition fees

Alternatively, if you have a Canadian bank account, you can follow the instructions mentioned below:

- 1. Contact your **financial institution** (bank, credit union or caisse populaire) in order to set up your bank account(s) for telephone or online banking.
- 2. When you are using the online banking, please select **Pay Bill** and add **York University** as a new Payee
- 3. Use your **York student number** (9-digit) as the account number
- 4. Transfer **\$300** to your account.

#### **Please note:**

When you pay through telephone or online banking, it may take up to 4 business days for your payment to be transferred to your York student account.

A registration deposit is **required only once**, for the very first academic session in which you enrol in courses. Since the deposit is part of your tuition, it will not appear as a separate charge on your student account statement.





## **Important Things to Consider:**

#### Estimating your time

- Be mindful of your time gap between classes
- Be realistic with the time of the day you pick
- Keep your commute duration in mind when building your timetable

#### Timetable best practices

- Read the course description well
- Understand the course delivery method
