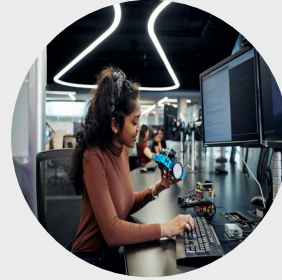

Application dates are:

Trimester 1 2024

Application: 30 October 2023
Teaching: 4 March – 14 June 2024

Trimester 2 2024

Application: 10 April 2024
Teaching: 8 July – 18 October 2024

Trimester 3 2023

Application: 30 August 2024
Teaching: 4 November – 14 February 2025



Application process

- You will be provided with an application link
- You need to upload copy of passport, transcript in English and a proof of English language skills (if applicable)
- You need to select 5 – 6 units
- Unit selection through Deakin Handbook or pre-approved unit list
- Onshore students need a minimum of 3 units on campus as per visa requirement, the fourth unit can be online



Entry requirements

Academic entry requirements

Completion of Year 12 (or equivalent) to meet the minimum requirements.

English language requirements

- All incoming **undergraduate students** are required to meet **English Band A**.
- All incoming **postgraduate students** are required to meet **English Band B**.

1. **IELTS** Overall 6.5, no band less than 6.0 (no more than 2 years old)
2. **TOEFL (IBT)** 70 Writing 21 (no more than 2 years old)
3. **TOEFL (PBT)** 577 Writing 4.5 (no more than 2 years old)
4. Medium of instruction letter (MOI)
5. **Pass DUELI Test** by Deakin University English Language Institute

Offer, health insurance, visas

- Offer letters are issued when all entry requirements are met, and units assessed and approved by the Faculties
- Offer letters will reflect all selected and approved units that you can potentially enrol in
- The health cover (OSHC) amount is outlined in the offer letter
- Deakin is happy to organise the health cover through BUPA
- After offer acceptance, you will receive the eCoE (Confirmation of Enrolment, an official Australian Government document)
- eCoE and OSHC policy are needed when applying for the visa
- You will need to apply for the Student Visa 500 – **non-award sector**, which currently has reasonable processing times



Arrival & study commencement

- We recommend arriving appr. 2 weeks before teaching commences
- We offer a complimentary airport pickup service for you and provide instruction in the Welcome Email
- Campus wide orientation week will take place 1 week prior to teaching
- You need to attend the compulsory Welcome Session (either on campus or online)
- Enrolment instructions will be sent out 4 weeks prior to commencement of trimester
- Once enrolled, you can change pre-selected units by submitting the Enrolment Variation Form to the relevant faculty or Student Central
- You should only change units up until week 2 of teaching
