





What does it mean to study in Canada as an international student?

- Finances are so important!
- > Planning ahead is crucial to success.
- Think about your full degree, not just your first year.
- Anticipating the unexpected can help ease stress.
- Limits to scholarships and bursaries.
- Prioritizing your financial education is so valuable.



General Expenses

Undergraduate International Student Fees and Expenses Estimate Please note that all costs are estimates and are subject to change.

Full time tuition for most non-professional programs	\$32,397 (CompSci) - \$37,440 (BCom) (most Liberal Arts and Sciences sit at \$35,148 for 30 credits)
Textbooks and supplies	\$1,200 - \$2,600 (varies by program)
Residence	Start at \$7,418
Meal plan	\$3,000 - \$6,000
Personal expenses living on campus	\$1,600
Living off campus	\$20,000 (average cost of 1 bdrm unit in Toronto is \$2,548)
Personal expenses if living off campus	\$4,000
Health and dental care	\$1,026


Scholarships, Awards and Bursaries

The Student Financial Profile (SFP) is a multipurpose online application form that is used to apply for:

- Undergraduate Scholarships and Awards
- York University Undergraduate Bursary program
- Work/Study Program

Deadline information can be found at https://sfs.yorku.ca/aid/sfp.

The SFP typically opens during the first week of August for Fall/Winter programs and in early April for Summer programs.



Receiving University Funds



Recipients notified by email.



Students must be enrolled in courses and registered active for funding to be released; funding applied to recipients' student account first to cover tuition and other student fees.



Refund can be requested where the award recipient has no outstanding balance. Students must provide the university with their banking information to allow for direct deposit of refunds to their bank accounts.



University reserves the right to recover funds if a student withdraws from the study period in which funds were awarded.





Work/Study Program

Approximately 1800 opportunities available annually under three programs

- RAY (Research at York)
- LEAP (Leadership, Engagement and Ambassadorship Program)
- General Work/Study

Opportunities open to all full-time international undergraduate students; financial need is not a requirement

Competitive wages (min. wage to \$23/hr); capped at 15 hrs/wk for Fall/Winter and 35 hrs/wk for Summer



So many opportunities to gain Canadian work experience, right here on campus!



Work Study Eligibility for International Students

- Full time undergraduate students enrolled in a degree program
- Must hold a valid study permit for the period of employment which includes conditions that permit the student to work in Canada
- Must meet the specific skills and experience requirements of the position

Fall/Winter Eligibility

> Full-time enrolment is defined as a minimum 18 credits (min. 9 per term); for students with disabilities the requirement is a minimum 12 credits (min. 6 per term)

Summer Eligibility

> Full-time enrolment is defined as a minimum 9 credits; 6 credits for students with disabilities OR the student must have been enrolled on a full-time basis in the preceding Winter term AND be returning to full time studies for the upcoming Fall term

Restrictions

- Students can only hold one work study position within the same employment period
- Non-degree students are ineligible (i.e., visiting students or students on LOP)
- Students cannot hold a work study position in the same term in which they are holding an NSERC Undergraduate Student Research position or equivalent






