

Arriving in Canada

Review the Government of Canada's official webpage on <u>preparing</u>

for arrival in Canada as an international student for a detailed checklist and the most up-to-date information.

Keep the following documents in your possession before you travel to Canada. Do not place these documents in your checked luggage.

Immigration Documents You Should

Bring

- Valid passport
- Valid Temporary Resident Visa (<u>TRV</u>), Electronic Travel Authorization (<u>eTA</u>), or <u>official status U.S. status</u> document
- <u>Letter of introduction</u> that the visa office sent you
 when they approved your study permit <u>unless you do</u>
 <u>not need one</u> OR a valid study permit if you are a
 returning student and it was previously issued.
- York University Letter of Acceptance (via <u>MyFile</u>)
- Proof of Enrolment
- Proof of funds to support your stay in Canada, such as a current bank statement. If you paid your tuition you can download a statement via your student account.
- Valid immigration <u>medical exam</u> results, if applicable.
 The exam must be valid for 12 months from the day you get it and must be valid the day you enter Canada.
- Check travel restrictions

If applicable:

- English Language Proficiency Exam Results (hard copy)
- · Medical and immunization records
- Spouses and dependents of International Students













AFTER ARRIVING IN CANADA

- Learn about transportation from Pearson
 International Airport to York University which is
 22 minutes away (<u>Airport Taxi</u>, <u>Uber</u>, <u>Lyft</u>)
- Attend <u>Academic Orientation</u> on January 5th
