This territory is subject of the Dish with One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, an agreement to peaceably share and care for the Great Lakes region.



> National animal: beaver
























Common Things Seen in Canada!

WARM SEASON

- Lasts 3-5 months (June to mid-September)
