What is a co-op work permit?

It is a paper document issued by IRCC to allow you to complete a work experience that is part of your studies.

If you are in a co-op program that is a **required** and **integral** part of your studies, you need a co-op work permit **before you can start working**. It does not matter whether the work is paid or unpaid.

The employer on your permit will be York University.

All work must be approved by your co-op program office (hours, location, employer).

You cannot use the co-op work permit for work that is not part of your co-op program.



DID YOU KNOW?

What IRCC calls a co-op can be called an internship, placement, practicum, etc. by York.



Working off campus

You can work off-campus, without a work permit, if you meet **all** of these requirements:

- you have a valid study permit that includes a condition that says you can work off-campus
- you're a full-time student at a <u>designated learning institution</u> (<u>DLI</u>)
- > you're enrolled in a postsecondary <u>academic</u>, <u>vocational</u> or <u>professional training</u> program
- you've started studying
- your study program
 - is at least 6 months long, and
 - leads to a degree, diploma or certificate
- you have a Social Insurance Number (SIN)



Can I work off-campus while on co-op?

As long as you are eligible to work off-campus, the co-op work permit does not prevent you from this.



Working on campus

You can work on your school campus, without a work permit, if you:

- > are a full-time post-secondary student
- have a valid study permit, and
- have a Social Insurance Number (SIN).



Can I work on campus while on co-op?

As long as you are eligible to work on-campus, the co-op work permit does not prevent you from this.



Am I a full-time student?

- > We recommend international students **maintain full-time student status** not only to be eligible to work with their study permits, but also to remain eligible for a post-graduation work permit
- > To be full-time, undergraduate students must be registered in a minimum of:
 - 9 credits each Fall and
 - 9 credits each Winter
- > For graduate students, your program defines your full/part-time status
- > All students are considered full-time while on a co-op term





Eligibility

Some study programs include work experience as part of their curriculum. You can apply for a coop or intern work permit if:

- you have a valid study permit
- work is required to complete your study program in Canada
- > you have a letter from your <u>school</u> that confirms all students in your program need to complete work placements to get their degree, and
- > your co-op placement or internship totals 50% or less of your study program





Co-op Letter

You must provide a letter form York indicating that work is a component of academic program that all participants are expected to complete in order to receive the degree, diploma or certificate.

The letter must include:

- Details of the work to be performed
- The specific number of hours per term or semester.



Confirmation of current enrolment

As you are a current student, you should be providing proof of enrolment. Only students starting a new program should provide a letter of acceptance. Your letter of enrolment should confirm:

- 1. your enrolment for the next academic session and
- 2. your expected graduation date.

HOW TO REQUEST YOUR LETTER OF ENROLMENT

- 1. Visit this website: https://registrar.yorku.ca/program/letters.
- 2. Under the tab, choose undergraduate or graduate as appropriate and select option #3, "I need a special or customized confirmation letter that is not available from MyCreds.ca at this time."
- 3. Complete the Letter and Document Verification Request form and select the option, "Student Visa Extension Application."
- 4. Email the form to yuverify@yorku.ca. In the body of the email, mention that you are an international student and that you are requesting the confirmation of enrolment letter for the purpose of your study permit extension application.
- 5. The letter will take about weeks to prepare. Once it is prepared, you will receive a link to pay for the letter which costs \$25.
- 6. Once payment is confirmed, you will be emailed a copy of the letter.

SCHOOL OF CONTINUING STUDIES

Your letter of enrolment is available in your Student Portal.



QUICK FAQ

WHEN WILL MY CO-OP WORK PERMIT EXPIRE?

The co-op work permit is usually issued for the same time as your study permit.

DO I NEED TO ALSO EXTEND MY STUDY PERMIT?

If your study permit is expiring soon (in the next 3 months), you can apply to extend your study permit at the same time as you apply for a co-op work permit.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

The co-op work permit is free.

If you are also applying for a study permit, you will need to pay for your study permit.

HOW LONG WILL IT TAKE TO GET MY PERMIT?

Currently from inside Canada, the processing times are:

- Work permit only: 90 days
- Study permit extension:44 days


We have different accounts for some applications.



Personal checklist

Personal Reference Code

If you have already completed the Come to Canada or the Express Entry wizard, you would have received a document checklist and/or a personal reference code based on the answers you provided.



I do not have a Personal Reference Code

If you do not have a personal reference code, you may answer a series of questions to find out if you are eligible to apply for a visa and/or permit, apply for Express Entry, and begin an online application.

If you begin your application after you have logged into your account, you will not receive a personal reference code, as the system will save your document checklist right into your account.

When does your study permit expire?




If your study permit is expiring in the next 6 months, you can select YES. If not, you should select NO as it is too early to request a study permit extension at this time. When it is time to extend your study permit, you can also extend your co-op work permit.

What about biometrics?

Biometrics (fingerprints and photo) are valid for 10 years. If you're not sure if your biometrics are still valid, you can use the <u>Check Status tool</u>.

To avoid delays due to biometrics, make sure to:

- Pay the biometric fee with your application
- Book an appointment for biometrics as soon as you get your biometrics instruction letter





Quick tips on filling out the IMM forms

- Only fields with * are mandatory
- UCI is on your study permit
- Personal details:
 - Your status is student.
 - From [date you first got student status]
 - To [study permit expiry date]
- Contact information:
 - The mailing address is where your documents will be mailed. Make sure it is an address you are checking.
- Coming into Canada:
 - Original is the first time you came to Canada
 - Most recent is the last time you entered Canada
- Previous Employment:
 - If you haven't been employed, enter student as your current occupation. Only the first section is required.



Social Insurance Number

- Your study permit and SIN will expire at the same time
- You can only apply to renew your SIN once you have the new (extended) study permit. You can apply for a SIN online or at a Service Canada Centre.
- As long as you submit your study permit extension before the expiry of your study permit, you
 can continue to use your SIN (assuming you are eligible to work).
