



Class Format	Lectures, computer simulations, case discussions, individual and group projects.
Attendance	Class participation is mandatory and part of the student's final grade in most courses. Select your courses carefully and enroll only if you can commit.
Course Requirement	Exchange students can select SHSS courses as long as they meet the prerequisite requirements and are subject to space availabilities. Some courses may require professor approval for enrollment.
Examinations	Final exams are within the last 2 weeks of school. Students are responsible to stay in HK until the last day of finals. Requests for early leave of exams are normally not considered.

## Living In Hong Kong



Language	Locals speak Cantonese while English and Mandarin are widely spoken.	
Getting Around	Hong Kong's public transportation system is considered to be world-class in terns of its efficiency. Getting around by Mass Transit Railway (MTR), Bus, Taxi is relatively quick.	
Telecommunication	WiFi are widely available, including airport, major tourist attractions, MTR stations and restaurants. You can purchase a prepaid SIM card or <u>Discover Hong Kong</u> Tourist SIM card easily.	
Banking	Most international banks have branches in Hong Kong. On HKUST campus, there are two banks: Hang Seng Bank and Bank of China.	







	<ul> <li>For postgraduate students, <u>off campus accommodation</u> is available near Clearwater Bay, such as Hang Hau just 15 minutes from campus on public transports or Sai Kung.</li> </ul>

Student Visa	<ul> <li>For all incoming exchange students (non-Hong Kong citizens), you are required for a student visa to study in HK. Student visa documents must be submitted in a TIMELY manner or will be withdrawn.</li> <li>Please expect that student visas may take up to 3 months to be approved by the Director of Immigration Department of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR).</li> <li>For Mainland Chinese students holding PRC passport, you will need an additional 2-4 weeks to apply for an EEP from your hometown after you have received your approved visa label.</li> </ul>
