About the University Health Insurance Plan

À propos du Régime d'assurance maladie universitaire



- > Eligible for coverage:
 - International degree students
 - Exchange students
 - IVRTs
 - Some visiting scholars
 - Dependant(s) of students/scholars listed above
- Degree and exchange students are automatically enrolled
- Dependants, IVRTs, and visiting scholars are NOT automatically enrolled- use the UHIP Application Form
- A late fee of \$500 applies for dependants enrolled more than 30 days after arrival in Canada
- Cost: \$63 per month (per person)

- Admissibles à la couverture :
 - Étudiants internationaux poursuivant un diplôme
 - Étudiants d'échange
 - Étudiants chercheurs internationaux invités
 - Certains chercheurs invités
 - Personnes à charge des étudiants/chercheurs mentionnés ci-dessus
- Les étudiants d'échange et ceux qui poursuivent un diplôme sont automatiquement inscrits
- Les personnes à charge, les étudiants chercheurs internationaux invités, et les chercheurs invités ne sont PAS automatiquement inscrits – utilisez le Formulaire de demande du RAMU
- Des frais de retard de 500 \$ s'appliquent aux personnes à charge inscrites plus de 30 jours après leur arrivée au Canada.
- > Coût: 63 \$ par mois (par personne)

WHAT IS THE YFS HEALTH AND DENTAL PLAN?

The YFS Health and Dental Plan is a comprehensive supplemental insurance plan that covers students for health, dental and extended health services all at a low cost!

Most full-time undergraduate students enrolled in 15 credits or more are automatically charged the fee. They are eligible to opt-out if they have comparable/alternative insurance.

Part-time students are not automatically charged but have the option to optin!

Our insurer is **Green Shield Canada**








OPT-IN/OUT WINDOW

There are two opt-in/out periods within the academic year. Students opt-in/out period depends on when they began their studies. Students **do not** have two opportunities to opt-in/out.

Fall: September 1-October 18, 2024 **Winter:** January 1-February 7, 2025.

Students opting in during the **Fall** coverage extends from September 1, 2024 to August 31, 2025, whereas **Winter** coverage extends from January 1, 2025 to August 31, 2025




OPTING OUT

Students who wish to opt out can do so before the opt out deadline by filling the opt-out application form available on the YFS website during that period.

Students are only able to fill out an opt out application once.

Note that the winter opt out is **only** for students starting courses in the winter.



OPT-OUT ELIGIBILITY

The YFS Health and Dental Plan is mandatory for all full-time undergraduate students with the exception of students who have alternative/comparable insurance. OHIP & UHIP are not considered alternative insurance.


*** Some opt-out applications may be denied by Green Shield Canada if the student fails to provide accurate or eligible information.



OPTING IN

Not all students are charged for the YFS Health and Dental Plan, this may include: Part-time students, students living with disabilities and graduating students.

These students can fill out the opt-in application or receive assistance with the Director to manually opt-in and may have to provide extra documents. Ex. Letter of Accommodation from Student Accessibility Services, a proof of graduation or a proof of enrollment in a co-op program.



ADDING DEPENDENTS

Active students in the plan have the ability to add dependents to their insurance at an additional cost. This has to be done prior to the deadline.

Eligible dependents: Spouse, Common Law Partner, Child(ren).

*** Proof of relationship is required.










The YFS HEALTH PLAN IS CARD-LESS!

- The York Federation of Students offers a card-less system. This means students won't receive benefit cards to present to service providers. All a student requires in order to access their insurance is their Plan Member ID and the name of their insurer.
- Students Plan Member ID is YFS+(your student number)-00 e.g. YFS123456789-00
- Insurance Company: Green Shield Canada
- Download the GSC everywhere app and create a login in order to receive a digital copy of your card!



What is the YUGSA Plan?

- The YUGSA Health plan is a supplementary health and dental plan covering prescription drugs, dental and extended health care such as psychologist sessions, massage therapy, chiropractic care, physiotherapy and vision care. The plan also covers AD & D and travel insurance for up to 60 days each trip.
- This plan is mandatory for all full-time graduate students (excluding TAs) and is optional for part-time students. The plan is in addition to UHIP/OHIP.
- Full time students get automatically charged and enrolled in the plan. Students with a comparable health & dental coverage can opt out of the plan within the deadline.

Annual Cost

Full time student (2024-25): \$410

Part time student (2024-25): \$815.84

Dependents can be added to the plan for an additional premium

Plan cycle

Students get charged for the insurance premium only once in an academic year. The plan cycle is as below:

Fall registered students: Sept. 01-Aug. 31

Winter registered students: Jan. 01 - Aug. 31

There is no enrollment in the summer term.

Black out period

Each year, there is a black out period at the beginning of the term which usually ends by the end of September. Your benefits will be inactive during this time and claims will not go through.

This happens because GSC collects and updates your enrolment information after receiving the files from the university. If you have incurred any medical expenses during this time, you can still submit them to the provider for reimbursement after the black out period is over.

What does the plan cover?

SUMMARY OF BENEFITS:

Prescription drugs: \$1000 max with 80% co-insurance

Dental: \$600 max. with 75% co-insurance

Vision: \$75 for a general eye exam, \$100 for prescribed lenses and frames or contact lenses every 24 consecutive months

Professional Services:-

No co-pay, \$25 per visit up to a maximum of \$300 per type of practitioner per benefit year: Naturopath, Osteopath, Speech Therapist (Rx required), Dietitian, Chiropodist, or Podiatrist.

Chiropractor: \$650 per benefit year.

Psychologist, Social Worker/Counsellor or Master of Social Work or Psychotherapist: \$125 per visit up to 10 visits combined, per benefit year.

Holistic Nutritional Consultant: \$125 per visit up to 15 visits combined with a Psychologist, Social Worker/Counsellor or Master of Social Work, or Psychotherapist per benefit year.

MindBeacon Therapist Guided Program: \$300 per benefit year.

Acupuncturist, Physiotherapist, Registered Massage Therapist (Rx required): \$50 per visit up to a maximum of \$600 per practitioner per benefit year.

AD&D and Travel Insurance Benefits.

How to use the plan

- Nearly all the pharmacies and dental offices in Canada accept Greenshield insurance and can bill them directly for their services once you provide them the information below:
- Insurance: Greenshield
- Certificate ID: YGS + your student no. + 00 (e.g. If your student number is 123456789, your Cert. ID will be YGS123456789-00)
- For all other benefits like vision, Physiotherapy, Massage therapy (Rx required), you can submit the claim online to the insurance from your Greenshield account.

Online registration

Register with Greenshield to create your online account:

https://gsceverywhere.ca/login

Through your account, you can:

- Submit claims electronically
- Download virtual benefit card
- Sign up for direct deposit (to get paid faster!)
- Read your full benefits booklet
- Search for a provider near you
- Search drugs by DIN to see if coverage eligibility
- And much more!

You can even submit claims right from your mobile device. Just download the GSC everywhere app.

Making Claims

- Pharmacies and dental office can bill the insurance directly so you don't have to submit any claims
- All other claims can be submitted online from your Greenshield account.
- If you want to mail the claim form, you can download customized claim form from your account and mail it to Greenshield on the address given in the form with original receipts.

Opting in

Who can opt in?

- Part time graduate students
- Dependents of full and part time graduate students

How to opt in?

- The opt in link is available on the Yugsa website at https://www.yugsa.ca/health-plan. Additional fees apply for dependents.
- THE OPT-IN DEADLINE for Winter' 25 registrants is Feb. 28, 2024

Opting out

Who can opt out?

Students with a valid alternate health insurance in Canada that includes both drug and dental coverage. OHIP/UHIP is not counted as alternate insurance.

How to opt out?

The opt out form can be submitted ONLINE at https://www.yugsa.ca/health-plan

• The deadline for Winter registrants is Feb. 28, 2024.

Coordination of Benefits

• If you have additional coverage from another insurance, the YUGSA plan allows for the coordination of benefits which means once you receive payment from one insurance, you can submit the outstanding balance to your other plan and get reimbursed up to a total of 100%.







