2.1. CALL FOR APPLICATIONS FOR POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIPS 2025/2027 THE DAN DAVID SOCIETY OF FELLOWS

The Dan David Society of Fellows is accepting applications for outstanding postdoctoral research in the study of the past. This two-year fellowship offers generous funding for international and Israeli scholars to conduct innovative research at Tel Aviv University, while benefiting from professional mentorship offered by faculty members.

The fellowship is open to candidates from all disciplines studying the human past, including but not limited to history, archaeology, art history, history of education, history of science, technology and medicine, physical anthropology, literature, philosophy, and digital humanities. Applicants must have completed their PhD between October 1, 2020, and September 1, 2025.

Value: \$40,000 per year

Brief Description and Thematic Areas

The Hemispheric University Consortium (HUC) Seed Fund aims to promote collaborative research among universities within the HUC network, fostering the creation of alliances that generate knowledge relevant to society and fund scalable projects that can secure larger competitive grants in the future.

Projects must align with HUC's thematic priorities: • *Public Health, Well-being, and Human Prosperity* • *Climate Change, Sustainability, and Resilience* • *Entrepreneurship and Inclusive Innovation* • *Crime, Conflict, and Corruption* • *Technology and Innovation for Education.*

Benefits and requisites

Value: Funds projects from USD\$12,000 **Duration:** Between 12 and 18 months

Requirements: Minimum of two HUC universities – each contributing USD 6K

2.3. CALL FOR APPLICATIONS ACU COMMONWEALTH CLIMATE RESILIENCE NETWORK GRANTS 2024-2025

The Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU) calls for applications for Commonwealth Climate Resilience Challenge Grants. Grants are awarded to member universities to support initiatives addressing climate resilience.

Open to academic and professional staff, the grants support the cost of organising projects that promote either of the two main strategic priorities of the Commonwealth Climate Resilience Network (CCRN):

- Enhancing the climate resilience of universities themselves
- Enhancing universities' contribution to the resilience of communities, business and government

Ideas for using the grants

The grants can be used for a diverse range of projects, workshops and events in one of the following project focus areas:



- Improving learning, teaching, and training for climate change adaptation e.g. virtual exchange or collaboration, teaching or professional practice collaboration and sharing and co-development of learning materials
- Increasing the research capacity of CCRN members in climate change adaptation –
 e.g. virtual fellowships or collaboration, comparative analyses, research
 management and uptake capacity building, understanding and documenting
 indigenous knowledge and resilience practices
- Improving institutional resilience policies and practice adopted by Commonwealth universities - e.g. developing tools, training and approaches to support contingency and continuity of operations planning at higher education institutions

To date, the grants have funded a diverse range of climate action projects in universities across the Commonwealth - from sea-temperature monitoring in the coral reefs of Fiji, to integrating indigenous knowledge on climate change adaptation with academia in New Zealand.

2.4. CALL FOR APPLICATIONS 2025-2026 OBW FACULTY RESEARCH EXCHANGE

The Ontario/Baden-Württemberg Faculty Research Exchange offers grants to support research visits to universities in the German state of Baden-Württemberg by faculty members at participating Ontario universities. The main objective of the OBW FRE is to promote new collaborative research partnerships and strengthen existing partnerships between researchers in Ontario and Baden-Württemberg.

The present competition is for grants to support research stays between March 1, 2025, and April 30, 2026. OBW Faculty Research Exchange grants will support researchers for a minimum of one month and a maximum of six months at the host university. Researchers who wish to stay longer than six months are still eligible to participate, but the maximum fundable period will be restricted to six months.

Value: monthly stipend of \$1,750, plus reimbursement for relocation expenses incurred at the beginning and end of the granting period up to a maximum of \$1,750

Duration: 1 to 6 months

2.6. GLOBAL RESEARCH PROGRAM: GLOBAL INTERNSHIPS FOR RESEARCH AND PRACTICE-BASED LEARNING, PONTIFICAL CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY OF CHILE

The Global Research Program is an on-site/virtual international experience program that supports research and creative projects in UC Chile within the Global Internships for Research and Practice-Based Learning framework.

The program aims to enhance and stimulate research collaboration at a global level, connecting UC Chile researchers with master's and senior undergraduate international students within new, creative, and innovative international research opportunities. The call is open to all areas of knowledge, and interdisciplinary projects are especially welcome to apply.

Students in their senior year of a bachelor's degree or those pursuing a master's degree are eligible to apply for internships. Applicants are responsible for submitting all required documents, including a one-page Statement of Purpose, an updated CV or resume, transcripts (non-official accepted), and language proficiency tests if applicable.

2.7. STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM AT LAS NUBES – INFORMATION SESSIONS

The Study Abroad Program at Las Nubes EcoCampus offers several courses during the academic year, through which students are given an unprecedented opportunity to interact with and learn from the local rural Costa Rican communities through first-hand lessons on tropical ecology, sustainability, indigenous education, arts, health, and conservation.
