

Critical Thinking Over Memorization


Canadian classrooms value analyzing and questioning ideas, not just remembering facts.

Small vs. Large Classrooms: Each Has Its Perks!

Smaller classes mean deep discussions and closer connections, while larger ones are perfect for big ideas and lively lectures.

Professor-to-Student: More Like a Partnership

Canadian professors see students as collaborators in learning. They're approachable, often inviting students to discuss ideas and ask questions freely.

Self-Directed Learning

Pre-class readings have helped her follow along and participate confidently. Ayesha schedules her pre-class preparation.




Ayesha's Tricks for Staying Ahead

Respect Goes a Long Way


Ayesha mutes her devices, skips side conversations, and stays focused. Creating a considerate atmosphere benefits everyone in the room!

Understanding York U's grading scale helps Ayesha set realistic goals and know what's expected to succeed in each course.




Attendance, participation, and coming prepared are key. Engaging in discussions not only boosts her grades but also connects her with professors.

Group work at York isn't just 'divide and conquer' like in high school. It's about truly working together and blending different strengths


Master the Art of Clear Communication

Assign roles early, like 'research lead' or 'presentation lead.' Everyone knows what's up, and the work runs smoother.


Teamwork with Integrity

Citations Matter

Think of academic honesty as the golden rule: If it's not your work, don't claim it. Proper citations aren't just a rule; they show respect for others' ideas.



Integrity = Success

Integrity in every project, exam, or essay builds trust and confidence in yourself and with your peers. Plus, it sets you up for future wins—employers value honesty!

Consequences Aren't Just Grades

Academic offenses can impact more than your GPA—they can affect scholarships, internships, and your reputation. Stay true to your values.






ACADEMIC INTEGRITY IN ACTION: WHAT TO KNOW AND WHERE TO GET HELP

Group Work Boundaries

Working together is great—but make sure each person does their part. Don't copy each other's work and always check what's allowed for team assignments.

Common Offenses

Copy-pasting from Wikipedia? Big no-no. Sharing answers or giving too much help can cross the line into cheating. It's also risky. Remember: shortcuts come with long-term setbacks.









AI & Tech Tools

Tools like ChatGPT, Grammarly, or translation software can be helpful—but using them without permission can count as academic misconduct.

Always check your course rules or ask your professor what's allowed.

Cultural Differences Matter

Academic rules may be different from what you're used to. For example, in some places, sharing work or memorizing answers is normal, but here it might break the rules.

Learning the expectations here takes time.


The staff at the YorkU Libraries will always be happy to help! Find resources and workshops on research skills and avoiding plagiarism.

Set Clear Deadlines

Don't just plan for the final due date—break your project into smaller tasks and assign deadlines to each. Set these early and stick to them to stay on track.

Come Prepared to Class

Review any assigned readings or videos beforehand. Take notes and highlight anything unclear. This way, you can focus on listening during class and come ready with thoughtful questions.

Use Your Syllabus!






